And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil: For Thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

Most holy and merciful Father; we confess our sinfulness, and seek Thy pardon. We have not loved Thee with all our heart, neither have we loved our neighbour as ourselves. We acknowledge before Thee our national sins and shortcomings, and our own unworthiness. Forgive us our pride, our self-will, and our forgetfulness of Thee. Turn us again to Thyself; have mercy upon us; and cleanse us from our sins, for the sake of Thy dear Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

O God, who hast preserved us by Thy mercy unto this day, and richly blessed us with Thy truth: enable us whom Thou hast united under one Sovereign to fulfil, in brotherhood and concord, Thy purpose for us in the world. Receive, we beseech Thee, our supplications and prayers; and grant that, under Thy protection and guidance, we may evermore live as Thy people, and know Thee to be our God; through Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom, with Thee, O Father, and the Holy Spirit, be all honour and glory, world without end. Amen.

To Thee all Angels cry aloud: the Heavens, and all the Powers therein.

To Thee Cherubin, and Seraphin: continually do cry,

Holy, Holy, Holy: Lord God of Sabaoth;

Heaven and earth are full: of the Majesty of Thy Glory.

The glorious company of the Apostles: praise Thee.

The goodly fellowship of the Prophets: praise Thee.

The noble army of Martyrs: praise Thee.

The holy Church throughout all the world: doth acknowledge Thee;

The Father: of an infinite Majesty;

Thine honourable, true: and only Son;

Also the Holy Ghost: the Comforter.

Thou art the King of Glory: O Christ.

Thou art the everlasting Son: of the Father.

When Thou tookest upon Thee to deliver man: Thou didst not abhor the Virgin's womb.

When Thou hadst overcome the sharpness of death: Thou didst open the Kingdom of Heaven to all believers.

Thou sittest at the right hand of God: in the Glory of the Father.

Then shall be read a Lesson from the New Testament: St. Matthew v, 1-16, or Romans xii

Then shall be sung the following Hymn:

Our fathers' sepulchres are here,

Lord of the nations, thus to Thee Our country we commend; Be Thou her refuge and her trust, Her everlasting Friend.

Bestow upon her such gifts as she needs for Thy service; preserve her in the faith and love of Thy name; and grant that she may reign over us in honour, and in the affection of her peoples. Enable her so to bear the burden of an earthly crown and to do Thy will, that hereafter she may receive the crown of life, which Thou hast promised to them that love Thee.

Lord, hear our prayer;

And let our cry come unto Thee.

We humbly beseech Thee, O most merciful Father, to give to Thy servant Philip Duke of Edinburgh wisdom and grace to comfort and support Her Majesty the Queen as she fulfils her high calling. Spare them to one another and to us in health and strength through many years. Let Thy blessing so rest upon Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother, Queen Mary, Charles Duke of Cornwall, and all the members of the Royal Family, that they may continue to set before us an example of Christian living and lead us in Thy way.

O ETERNAL LORD GOD, who hast given Thy Son Jesus Christ to be the resurrection and the life of all who believe in Him: grant to Thy Church in heaven and on earth a living and abiding faith in Thee. Receive our thanksgiving for all with whom we are one in the communion of saints; and bring us all at last to the eternal joys of Thy heavenly kingdom; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who ever liveth and reigneth with Thee, the Father, and the Holy Spirit, one God, world without end. Amen.
